Dual Enrollment lets you enroll in a course that counts toward your high school graduation as well as earns you college credit at the same time. The state of Tennessee offers grants for dual enrollment students to cover tuition and mandatory fees. Eligible students may apply online at **tn.gov**. Students who do not meet the grant eligibility requirements may still dual enroll, but will need to pay tuition/fees out of pocket.
